Some parents/carers are already very skilled in monitoring their child's use, whilst some of us may not even realise what the children can do and how it can be disguised. Please use the link below to assist you in finding out how to monitor what your child is doing online.

Think about how you can support by: removing devices before bedtime; adding parental controls; and limiting time online. After all, most of us pay for these devices! We appreciate your support in ensuring that our students are able to use their phones responsibly and with maturity and kindness.




How to complete my Sparx Maths homework

1. Open the website <https://www.sparxmaths.com/>




2. Click Login

YOUNG CARERS

STARTING secondary school is an exciting step – and we want every young person in our community to feel supported.

Some of our students are Young Carers: children and young people who help to look after a family member with an illness, disability, mental health condition or addiction. Their caring role can be practical (helping around the house); emotional (offering support and reassurance); or a mix of both.

At Lipson, we are proud to have a strong Young Carers network. We:

- Meet regularly so students can support one another and share experiences;
- Offer social opportunities to build friendships and enjoy time away from caring responsibilities;
- Provide tailored support: in the lower years, this often means creating a safe space and building connections, while, in the upper years, it can include guidance with study schedules; exam preparation; and even support with university or apprenticeship applications.

We know that caring can sometimes make school feel more challenging, and our goal is to ensure that no young person feels alone in balancing their role at home with their education and social life.

If you think your child may be a Young Carer, please let us know by emailing youngcarers@lipson.plymouth.sch.uk. Identifying them early means we can make sure they have the right support in place as they settle into Year 7 and beyond.
