"It was so much fun getting to write about a film I love. I've not done this before, we got to be creative and have our own voice!"

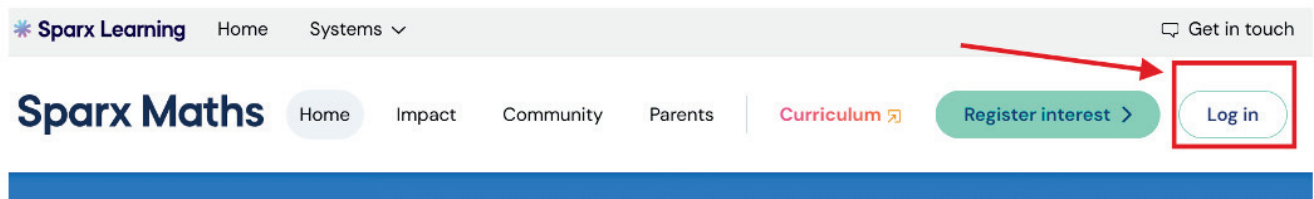

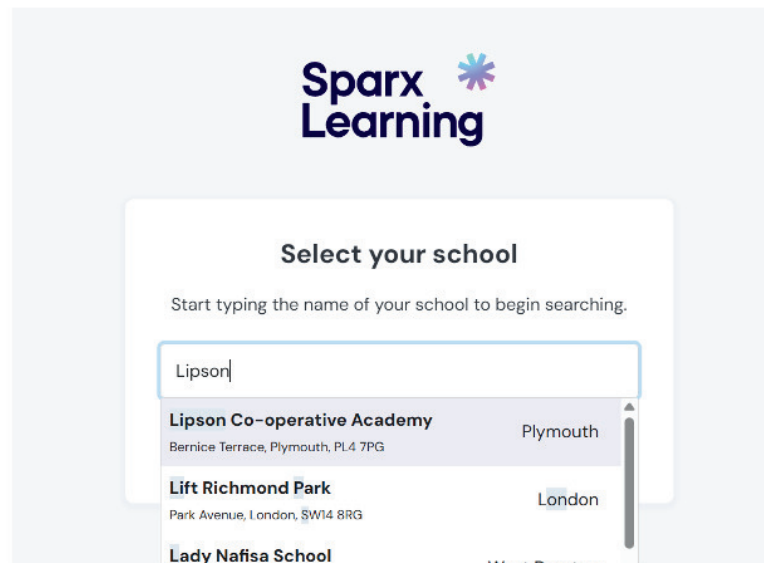

How to complete my Sparx Maths homework

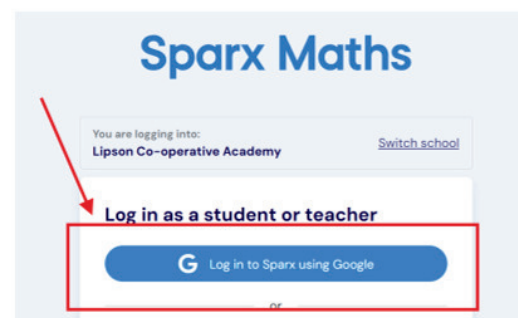
1. Open the website <https://www.sparxmaths.com/>



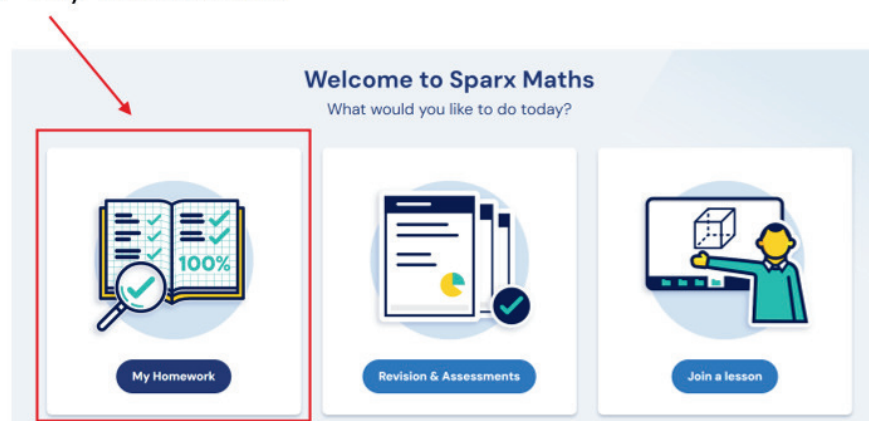
2. Click Login

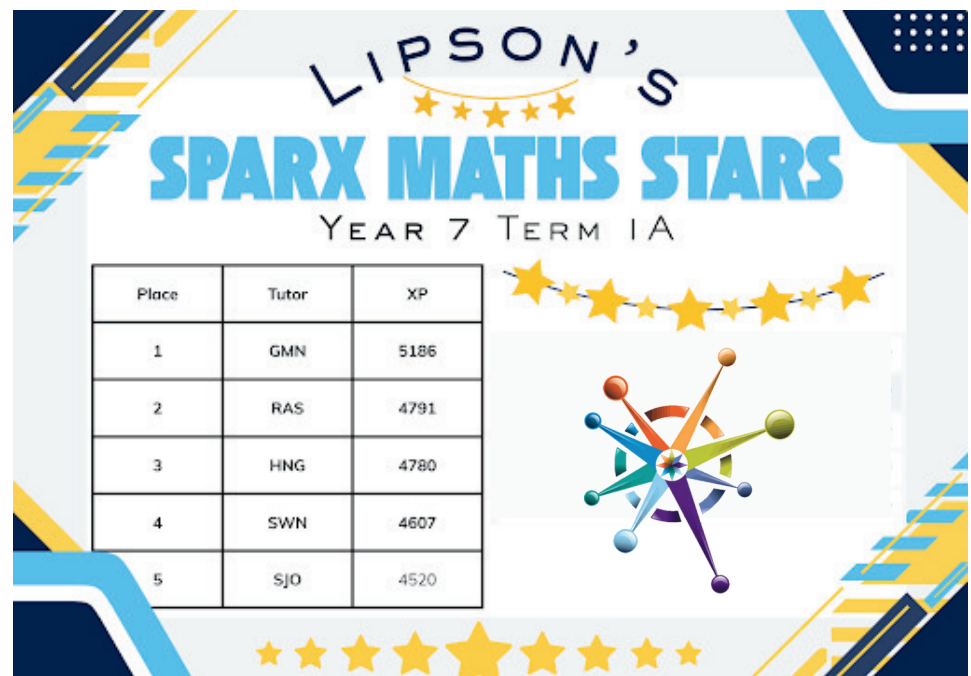
SPARX
